Flying Lessons

One day when the baby eagle is three months old and about 80% of its full-grown size, mama and papa start behaving very strangely. Mama stomps into the nest squawking and throwing all the soft fur and feathers out of the nest sweeping it clean. With all the softness gone the nest becomes uncomfortable. With all the comfort gone the baby eagle must learn to balance itself, to stand.

This pattern is repeated as many times as is necessary until the baby eagle realizes that by spreading her wings and catching the wind current, she can soar like Mama and Papa. What seemed cruel has turned out for her good.

Mama and Papa celebrate their child's achievement by locking talons and doing acrobatics in the air. They endured their little one's anger and protests and fear so that this baby could grow to maturity and soar like an eagle.

The lesson of the eagle is one of trust and faith, giving our lives over to God and trusting. **And trusting**... "Think of this: 'The LORD your God is with you, he is mighty to save.

He will take great delight in you, he will quiet you with his love, he will rejoice over you with singing.' Zephaniah 3:17.
