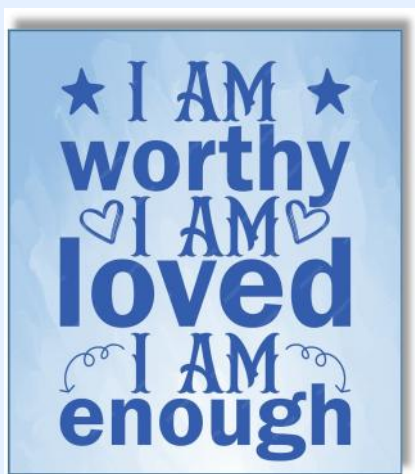

Greetings from your 2026 Action Team!

Your WELCA action team is excited and happy to announce our service projects for our 2026 convention this June! Our theme (“I am loved, I am worthy, I am enough”) and our scripture verse remind us of how powerful we are when we work together. We cannot wait to greet you in Newberry!

We have selected to do two different local projects allowing your WELCA group to expand your work into significant areas in your home town and to help meet the needs of others in our state. The first project is one that supports a local food bank in Newberry. “GAAP” or God’s Abundance for All. Please see page 6 for details.

Our action committee is also excited to encourage a second local project in support of WELCA’s 2025 Birthday Cake Resolution which aligns with the ELCA initiative “Raising Up Healthy Women and Girls”. Please find the details on page 7.

Lutheran Global Project

Our global project will be to support the Kyshu Gakuin Lutheran school in Japan, one of our SC Synod companion churches. The school (originally a girl’s school) was established by Lutheran missionaries and is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. The school has indicated a special need for library books and a security gate. We have set a goal of \$10,000. Monetary donations should be made out to SC WELCA with the note “Japan school.” Special note: Our SC synod’s Japan Task Force is partnering with this year’s celebration of the school.

COMMUNITY



The Community Committee Teen Suicide Task Force is proud to announce the receipt of a \$5,000 grant from the Katie Fund. This is a meaningful investment in the mental health and well-being of our youth. These funds will be put to work in several impactful ways. First and foremost, the Task Force will use the grant to train one to two individuals from within SCWELCA to become certified instructors in Mental Health CPR - equipping

our community with trained advocates who can recognize the warning signs of mental health crises and respond effectively.

Beyond training, the grant will support outreach and education efforts, including the promotion of upcoming Mental Health CPR classes and the presentation of an informational workshop at the convention. Funds will also be used to develop and distribute materials that raise awareness and encourage community members to participate.

Mental Health CPR is a vital skill — just as physical CPR can save a life in a medical emergency, knowing how to respond to a mental health crisis can make all the difference for a young person in need. We are deeply grateful to the Katie Fund for making this work possible and look forward to expanding our reach across the SCWELCA community.

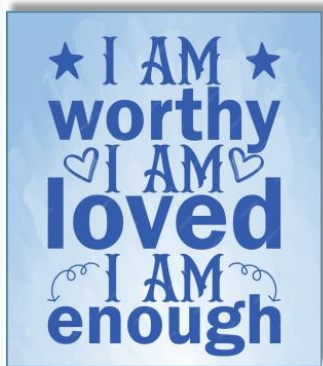

Workshops:

1. Bible Study: Led by our Convention Chaplain, Rev. Rebecca Wicker.
2. Teen Suicide Prevention Task Force, Jennifer Miller. *Mental Health First Aid* is an evidence-based program that equips individuals to recognize, understand, and respond to signs of mental health challenges or crises. Participants learn practical tools for offering initial support to someone who may be experiencing depression, anxiety, or suicidal thoughts, and how to connect them with appropriate professional help.
3. Churchwide Rep. and SC WELCA board members: Q&A. Questions will be answered by our Churchwide Rep and members of the SCWELCA board.
4. Craft/Service Project: Crosses made from nails and wires. Limited to 50 ladies.
5. TOUR: Newberry Nursing School Tour: Tour this new facility on the Newberry College campus. The Darby Nursing and Health Science Center at Newberry College has opened its doors, providing state-of-the-art facilities for nursing and health science programs. It includes modern classrooms, simulation labs, and a partnership with Newberry County Memorial Hospital for an Urgent Care Center. The center represents a significant investment in the future of healthcare in South Carolina.
6. Life of a Lutheran Missionary: Learn what life is all about living as a missionary in Japan. Our leader, Joy Derrick spent her youth in Japan as the daughter of Lutheran Missionaries.
7. Chair yoga: Lead Susan Wessinger, co-owner of Newberry Yoga and member of Redeemer.
8. Women In Mission: Led by Michelle Gantt, SC WM provides resources for you and your church to help disciple the next generation of followers of Christ to live on mission.
9. Lutheran Disaster Relief Carolinas: Lead by Rev. Ruth Ann Sipe and Kelli Fulmer. Learn how LDR assists individuals and congregations to prepare for disaster and build a network of resources across North and South Carolina in response to disasters.

Local Projects: (GAAP) God’s Abundance for All People is an ecumenical food bank that serves a wide area in and around Newberry. It works in cooperation with the “Feed Thy Neighbor” kitchen where volunteers serve meals to those in need. GAAP is supported by multiple churches, including The Lutheran Church of The Redeemer. The GAAP mission is to provide supplemental groceries to families in financial need by allowing them the dignity to shop freely for groceries directly from the





shelves. GAAP has offered the following specific shelf-stable items to be considered by our convention efforts. **Shelf-stable meat – cans or pouches, Pop-top cans of beanie weenies (or similar product for homeless), Meal-in-a-can or pouch (like SpaghettiOs), Cereal, grits, oatmeal, granola bars, etc., Packs of crackers / snacks, and Rice or potatoes (precooked or instant).** All donations should be packed in sturdy boxes weighing no more than 30 lbs. A convention donation form will be provided to record the number of items enclosed and/or your monetary gift. Monetary donations are accepted, especially for the purchase of important perishable items.

BIRTHDAY BOXES

At the 2025 Convention we approved the “Birthday Boxes Resolution” The birthday box will include all the ingredients (see below) for a family to celebrate a birthday and should be delivered directly to a local food bank charity of your choice! To record the impact of this statewide project, a convention form is provided so that your group can record the number of donated birthday boxes you have donated.



Instructions for Birthday Boxes: include the following: candles, cake mix, disposable pan, frosting, can of Sprite. Possible miscellaneous items like napkins, balloons, birthday banner, blank birthday card, & paper plates. A card with directions would be enclosed: “Happy Birthday! To make a cake without eggs oil, & water, mix 1 can of sprite with the cake mix. Bake according to the “directions on back of box.”

GLOBAL PROJECTS: KYUSHU GAKUIN (SCHOOL) JAPAN



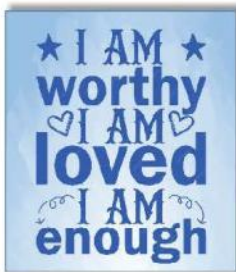
Kyushu Gakuin is a Christian school in the town of Kumamoto. This school was established 100 years ago by Lutheran missionaries and was originally a school for girls. They are an important voice for Christ and his church in a country that is still only 1% Christian. In fact, we have a Lutheran pastor, Pastor Miho Yasuhawa, right here in SC that attended the school. They are celebrating their 100th anniversary in October and our synod’s Japan Task Force would like to partner with them in their celebration.

They are currently in need of library books and a new gate for the newly established primary school. The pastor, Rev. Hitoshi Adachi, was so very excited about SCWELCA partnering with them. We are now collecting funds to help them with these important and necessary items for their school. Our goal is \$10,000. We can do this! You can give checks or pay online. Make checks payable to SCWELCA. Note on check “Japan Project”. The form will be mailed out soon.

Voting member(delegate): Two from each congregational unit. Members pay for meals, lodging, and registration.

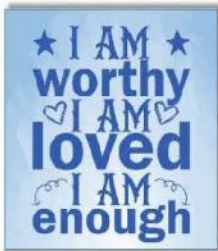
Visitor (non-voting): Those attending the convention either not on the agenda or assigned a specific responsibility. Visitors pay for meals, lodging, and registration.

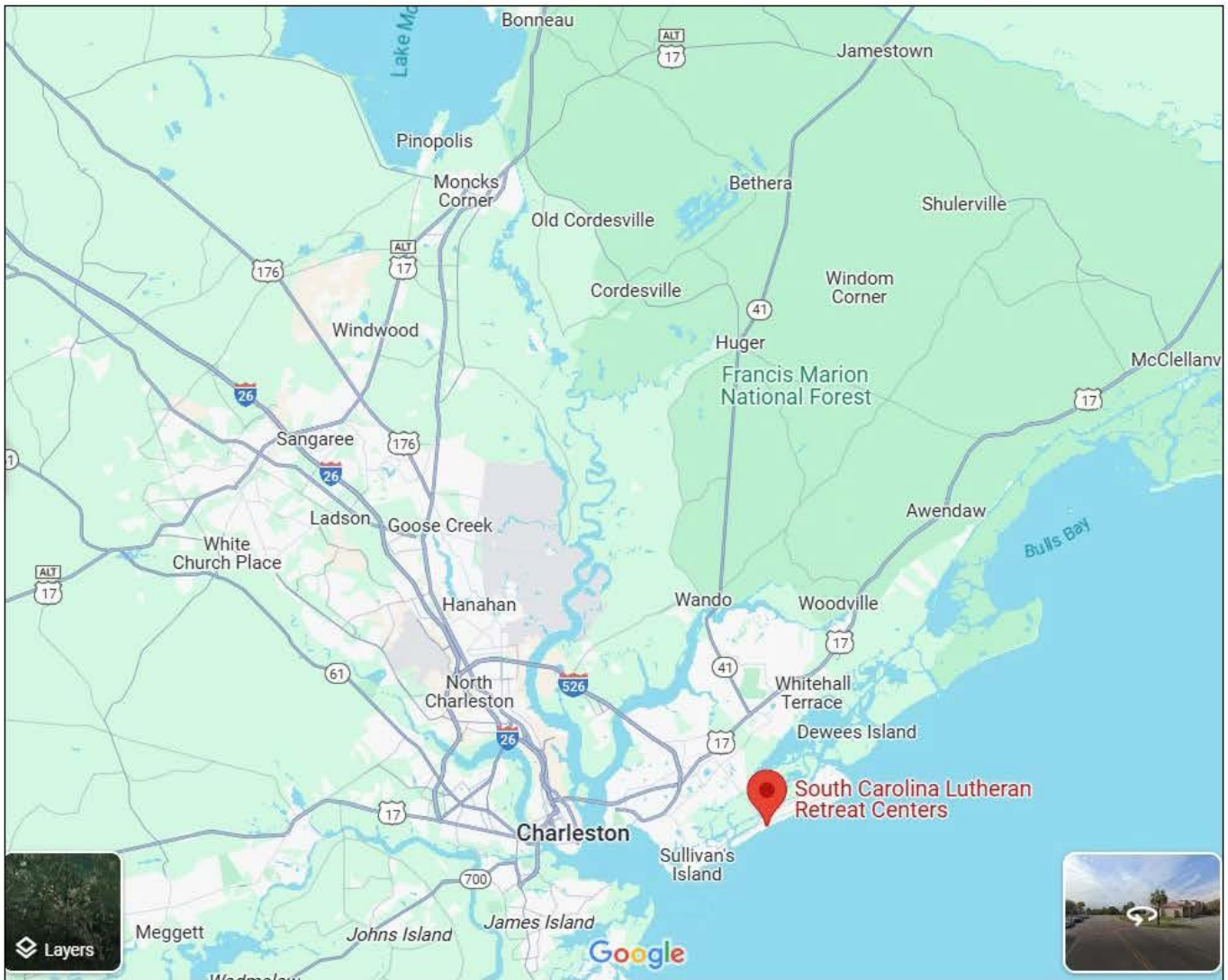

CONGREGATIONAL UNIT CORNER

KINDS OF UNITS



Most of our units are “congregational units” within single congregations.

There are also “inter-congregational units” with participants from two or more congregations that have no units. And there are “special units” composed of women in special settings without congregational affiliation.

Some examples of units have small groups that reflect the generations of the women. Women have cross- generational small groups. Some units have both. Some units are large with as many as 13 small groups (sometimes referred to as circles). Some units have five women. In every size unit there is a core group of women who develop the ministry plan and provide the opportunities of this organization to all women with their setting and beyond! Finding women in your congregation and communities with a common need or passion is an excellent way to start a new Circle or Group.

Sample types of circles/groups:

- ♦ Bible study
- ♦ Book clubs
- ♦ Quilting groups
- ♦ Lunch or dinner groups
- ♦ Project groups
- ♦ Mom’s day out groups
- ♦ Knitting and crocheting groups
- ♦ Crafting groups

SIX MODELS FOR UNITS

Women of the ELCA offers six different models for organizing your unit for mission. You can adjust them all or even create other models to get just the right fit for your unit. Remember, there is room for flexibility, creativity and a place for everyone to participate. Whether you are updating, reorganizing, or starting a new unit, below are the six models.

Model A: Board The board model has two to four officers and two to six committee chairs who are board members. The board plans the programs, handles communications and selects the materials to be used.

Model B: Coordinating Committee The coordinating committee model has four to seven committee members: two or three elected to specific positions and the others at-large. None of the sub-groupings have specific representation on the coordinating committee.

Model C: Coordinating Council The coordinating council model has four to nine council members, each representing a subgroup of women (for example, a Bible study group, quilters, a service group and so forth). Two or three leaders may be elected.

Model D: Co-leaders The co-leaders model has two elected or appointed leaders to coordinate ministries and unit programs.

Model E: Covenant The covenant model has two elected or appointed leaders with limited responsibility.



The participants agree to meet together for a specific purpose and for a specific length of time, disbanding or evaluating their commitment at the end of the time frame. This is the least structured model.

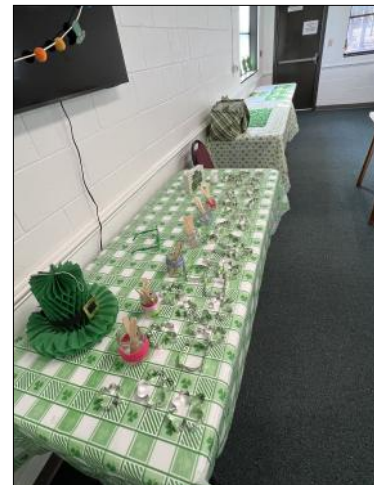
Model F: Team Model A team approach to organizational structure is fluid and easily altered as needs, interests and skills change. While it is necessary to have leaders designated to do things like convene the group, gather and disseminate information and act as treasurer, authority is shared and decisions are generally made by consensus. Leadership is developed based on the skills and gifts of individual women (and through mentoring). Ministry choices are based on the current interests of the group and the needs of the community.

Now that you have organized or revitalized your model for mission, review the approved Model Constitution and Bylaws for Congregational or Intercongregational Unit, Article VI—Leadership. Model constitutions are located at www.welca.org/leadertools.

Complete it or make the necessary changes. Submit a copy to Christie Gardner, our SC WELCA president, and keep a copy for your unit. Taking time to evaluate and refocus at least yearly will help to revitalize and strengthen your unit.
